JENNA BLUMBERG INVITED TO BE WA's AMBASSADOR

After losing a close friend to suicide, Jenna Blumberg, a 24-year-old UWA clinical psychology Masters and PhD student, decided to host a fundraiser for the non-for-profit organisation, R U OK.

R U OK aims to prevent suicide and depression, particularly in Australia, where 65,000 people try to take their lives each year.

The Blumberg family opened their home to the community on Saturday, 6 September to host an all-day fundraiser from 11am to 6pm. Over 150 people attended the event.

Jenna spent countless hours organising and promoting the event on social media, posting pictures and making sure people actively attended the fundraiser.

Over \$12,500 was raised for the organisation.

"I was overwhelmed by the amazing generosity and support from my family, friends and colleagues," she said.



Jenna coordinated the event on her own but had enormous help from her family and friends on the day, which made the event run smoothly.

Over 50 businesses kindly donated amazing prizes for a silent auction and raffle. The prizes included a gorgeous pair of diamond and sapphire earrings donated by Andrea (Maloon) Tighe from Loose Diamonds International and a signed Fremantle Dockers ball, which was auctioned for \$1,601.

The spread of food was decadent, as guests were treated to a rainbow cake that was themed in the organisation's bright yellow colours. Other treats included cake pops and yellow R U OK cupcakes with faces expressing different emotions.

Throughout the day, Jenna raised awareness of depression and suicide giving a powerful address. She spoke about R U OK Day on 11 September, urging people to talk openly about mental illness and have genuine conversations with anyone who may be struggling with life by asking them the question: R U OK? She spoke about how to respond to someone who turns around and says they are not ok.

She said, "No one stigmatises physical illnesses like cancer and diabetes, so people need to talk openly about mental illness to overcome the stigma."

She ended with an important message:

"Remember, suicide is a permanent solution to a temporary problem. Get help, reach out and if it's not you who is suffering, be there for those who are."

Jenna has now been asked to be the R U OK ambassador for Western Australia.

"I am truly humbled, honoured and excited about this opportunity as R U OK is so close to my heart," she said.

Egypt offers Abbas a Palestinian state in Sinai

Less than two weeks after the fighting between Israel and Gaza terrorists ended, Egyptian President Abdel-Fattah el-Sisi has reportedly presented an ambitious and generous solution: a Palestinian state in Sinai. Egypt has been working on the plan for several weeks, and presented it to Abbas in Cairo last weekend. The plan involves transferring 1,600km² to the Palestinian Authority, for the purpose of establishing a Palestinian state.

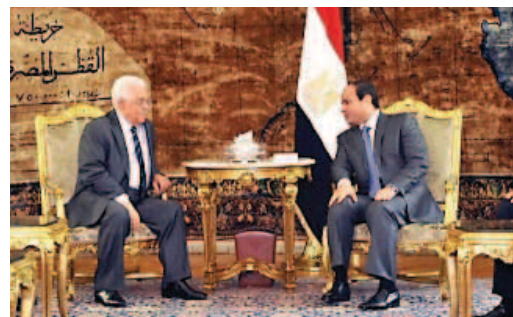
At its core, the Egyptian initiative proposes expanding the Gaza Strip to five times its current size and settling all the Palestinian refugees in a state to be established there. Under the initiative, this state will be demilitarised.

The Palestinian Authority would be granted autonomy in the Palestinian cities in the West Bank in exchange for relinquishing the Palestinian demand to return to 1967 borders.

Abbas has reportedly rejected the initiative despite substantial Egyptian pressure to accept it.

The US was involved and even green-lighted the initiative. Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu was also brought into the loop, but did not brief the cabinet on it.

A similar idea was floated eight years ago by Israeli academics, but it was rejected outright by the regime of Egyptian President Hosni Mubarak. Experts surmise that el-Sisi's generous



offer stems from Egypt's current difficulty in controlling terrorist groups based in the Sinai Peninsula.

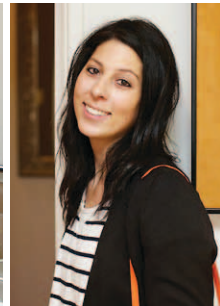

Socialist Alternative student club deregistered

Left-wing group, the *Socialist Alternative* (SA), was deregistered as a club by the Monash University Student Association last Tuesday, the same day a student from the same group at La Trobe University was threatened with expulsion following allegations of harassment of a Jewish student on campus.

The deregistration means the group can no longer hold political meetings or information stalls at Monash University's Clayton campus.

SA member Sarah Garnham, said the delisting was an "extremely harsh measure" and the group has said it would consider pursuing a legal case against the Monash Students Association.

The events at Monash University follow investigations by La Trobe University into allegations of harassment and intimidation of a Jewish student on campus.

The student making the complaints at La Trobe, Jessica Cornish, 25, is now represented by Arnold Bloch Leibler in her complaints of harassment and intimidation against the SA and *Students for Palestine*.

She said that after she voted down a motion condemning Israeli's "ethnic cleansing" and "genocide" in Gaza, posters were pasted on campus walls accusing her of supporting genocide. She also faced taunts by the students who called her "a Zionist piece of shit" and "genocidal pig."

Ryan Higginson, the La Trobe student threatened with expulsion, posted on Facebook that he rejected the allegations levelled against him as "an outrageous slander."

"All we have done is campaign in support of Palestinian rights, and against Zionists in the student union. These allegations, and the threat of expulsion, is a massive assault on political freedoms at La Trobe University," he wrote.

But a former member of the SA, who chose not to be named, said the club was "known to shut down and intimidate students with opposing views", to "bully other students" and to engage in "cultish behaviour".

He noted a recent student conference "in which 60-80 members of the SA surrounded three or four members of the Student Unity in a corner and went ballistic. Many prominent members of the Monash SA were involved in orchestrating this."

He also said the group would interrupt lectures to advertise an event and members have "at times physically resisted" when removed from lectures.

Tony Burke reignites ALP Israel clash with comments on settlements

Tony Burke MHR has reignited the clash in Labor over the Middle East by saying Jewish settlements in the West Bank are a ploy to block a two-state solution, and are "trashing" the drinking water of Palestinians.

So trenchant was Mr Burke in his criticism of Israel that he won the praise of Sydney academic Jake Lynch and the acknowledgment of Greens Senator Lee Rhiannon, known for their vocal support of the Boycott, Divestment and Sanctions campaign against Israel.

In a blistering attack on Israel during a keynote address to a pro-Palestinian fundraiser, the senior Labor frontbencher said anyone who supported Israel's bombing UN compounds in Gaza was "on the wrong side of that argument."

Mr Burke's speech in Sydney late last month to the Australia Palestine Advocacy Network went far beyond his previous comments in support of the Palestinian cause.

Labor's finance spokesman and manager of opposition business is one of the more outspoken in a group of ALP frontbenchers, including foreign affairs spokeswoman Tanya Plibersek, who lean towards the Palestinian side of the debate, in contrast to Labor leader Bill Shorten who is robustly pro-Israel.

In his speech, Mr Burke said, "When settlements are being built between Bethlehem and Ramallah, all the way south of Jericho, that's about preventing a two-state solution. It's about dividing territory to prevent there from being a workable state."

Mr Burke said he had met the *Friends of Palestine* group who had evidence that Palestinians had "had their drinking water trashed by a settlement upstream."

Mr Burke's remarks drew a sharp response from Victorian Labor MP Michael Danby who said Mr Burke and other pro-Palestinian Labor MPs needed to "get a more balanced perspective, especially on the missile attacks (from Gaza's Hamas organisation) that forced five million Israelis to the air-raid shelters."

A spokesman for the Opposition Leader reiterated ALP policy on the Middle East but said he declined to endorse Mr Burke's speech. Mr Burke's spokesman said his speech was "consistent with Labor's position on this issue".

Supporting terror: EU states buying Islamic State oil

The Ambassador for the European Union (EU) in Iraq, Jana Hybaskova, has admitted that several EU member states have bought oil from the Islamic State (IS, formerly ISIS) terrorist organisation that has been brutally conquering large portions of Iraq and Syria.

In addition to its implementation of brutal Islamic law, including numerous public executions, IS in late June captured Iraq's largest oil refinery, days later in early July, capturing the largest oil field in Syria, and another Syrian oil field a few days after that.

The US is leading a western effort to aid Iraqi government and Kurdish forces in rolling back IS's gains – with some effect – but the various seizures of infrastructure and resources have led IS to be assessed as the "world's richest terrorist organisation," and with EU states aiding it by buying IS oil, that economic power fueling the jihadist group seems only likely to grow further.

Belgium Jewish Museum shooter was 'ISIS torturer' in Syria

A freed French hostage has said the terrorist behind the deadly shooting at the Jewish Museum in Brussels in May was among his Islamic extremist captors in Syria, and was part of the Islamic State terror group.

Writing on the website of his former employer *Le Point* magazine, Nicolas Henin said Mehdi Nemmouche, who has been extradited to Belgium and held for questioning, was his jailer between July and December 2013.

One of a group of four journalist hostages freed in April, Henin said the 29-year-old, who spent more than a year fighting in Syria, was a feared and violent figure.

"When Nemmouche was not singing, he was torturing," wrote Henin. "He was part of a small group of Frenchmen whose visits would terrify the 50-odd Syrian prisoners held in the cells nearby."

"Every night the blows would start raining down in the room, where I was also interrogated. The torture lasted all night, until dawn prayers."

Child Survivor fund established

The Claims Conference has successfully negotiated a \$250 million landmark agreement with the German government, with a new fund to be established for Jewish Child Survivors of the Holocaust. This joint fund will provide support to Shoah survivors around the world who lived under Nazi occupation and will enable them to receive symbolic financial compensation for the traumas suffered during their childhood.

Those survivors of the Shoah who were born on 1 January 1928 or later and who were in concentration camps, ghettos, or for at least six months under Nazi occupation (or 12 months in Nazi Axis countries) in hiding or under false identity will be eligible to receive a special one-time payment of approximately \$3,280 because of special needs.

The agreement is subject to approval by the Bundestag and the Claims Conference. It is envisioned that the fund will become operational in January 2015.

Qatar backing Hamas, also funding Brookings Institute

Questions are emerging over possible conflicts-of-interest after *The New York Times* highlighted Qatari funding for US think-tanks, including the Brookings Institute, employer of former US envoy Martin Indyk, who was directly involved in recent negotiations between Israel and the Palestinians.

Last year Qatar agreed to a \$14.8 million, four-year donation to Brookings, which has helped fund a Brookings affiliate in Qatar and a project on United States relations with the Islamic world.

The report comes just weeks after Israel vociferously voiced objection to Qatar's funding of Israel's major adversary, terror group Hamas.

In July, then Israeli President Shimon Peres told United Nations Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon that Israel would not stand by while Qatar continued to finance Hamas militants.

In his last full day in office, Peres said, "Qatar does not have the right to send money for rockets and tunnels which are fired at innocent civilians. Their funding of terror must stop."

The Qatari government also paid for the UN Secretary-General's flight through the Middle East at the time, where his first stop was Doha, where he denounced Israel's Operation Protective Edge.

While Brookings said its personnel were "not influenced by the views of our funders," in 2012, *The Times* noted, the Qatari foreign ministry said that – thanks to a new accord with the institute, "the centre will assume its role in reflecting the bright image of Qatar in the international media, especially the American ones."

France leading country in the world for Jewish emigration to Israel

As of 31 August, 4,566 Jews had left France for Israel this year.

"We will get close to 6,000 departures from France in 2014," said Ariel Kandel, who heads the office in France of the Jewish Agency for Israel. The French figure was ahead of Ukraine (3,252), Russia (2,632) and the United States (2,218).

He cited a "climate of antisemitism that is losing its taboo" as well as economic difficulties in France, which is suffering from zero growth and record high unemployment.

Even before the latest Israel-Hamas war, Jewish community leaders said antisemitism levels had reached worrisome dimensions and were spurring record levels of Jewish emigration out of France.

‘Moderate’ Rouhani says Hamas ‘victory’ is thanks to Iran

“Moderate” Iranian President Hassan Rouhani has bragged of his regime’s role in aiding Hamas’s terror war against Israel, even as Iran is locked in a final round of negotiations with world powers over its nuclear program.

Rouhani claimed the “victory” of Gaza in Operation Protective Edge was only possible thanks to Iranian aid.

Rouhani has been presented to the world as a “moderate” but many have warned that his “charm offensive” provides cover for Iran’s ongoing nuclear program and human rights abuses.

Regarding Iranian aid to Hamas terrorists, the Islamic regime has boasted of providing rocket technology, including “Judgement Day” missiles, to be used against Israeli civilian centres. Senior Iranian officials likewise revealed last month that Iran is arming terrorists in Judea and Samaria, and vowed to continue supporting “the resistance” against Israel. Iran also launched an unprecedented cyber war on the Jewish state during Operation Protective Edge.

Israeli Intelligence Minister Yuval Steinitz, who is currently leading an Israeli delegation to the US to push for a firmer stance on Iran’s nuclear program, said that Iran has invested over \$200 billion into its nuclear program, and that the Islamic regime has only made “small concessions” in the talks, not budging on core issues such as uranium enrichment.

It is worth noting in January, the Iranian Supreme Leader Ayatollah Khamenei publicly revealed that the negotiations with the US about Iran’s nuclear program are merely a tactic to stall international pressure and gain time to continue nuclear development.

Jordan goes with Israel energy

The announcement of a planned energy deal between Israel and Jordan will be followed by several stages of negotiation, and it will be several years before the first gas reaches Jordan. The “nonbinding letter of intent” envisages the supply of gas from Israel’s Leviathan field. The gas will be supplied to Jordan’s main electricity-generating body. Over the fifteen-year proposed span of the contract, 1.6 trillion cubic feet will be supplied, probably sufficient for most of Jordan’s electricity-generation requirements.

Jordan currently relies on expensive fuel oil to generate electricity. The importation of natural gas from Egypt has become erratic because of pipeline sabotage, and seems unlikely to resume even if chronic Islamist terrorism in the Sinai is eventually contained.

The biggest challenge for Jordan’s King Abdullah, though, will likely be managing domestic political opposition to the deal. But it should also provide some welcome budget relief and longer-term energy security for the kingdom.

ISIS, Hamas and Hezbollah flags now illegal – PLO flags OK

Israeli citizens who wave the flags or display other symbols associated with ISIS, Hamas, Hezbollah, or other terror organisations, will be subject to arrest and prosecution, Attorney General Yehuda Weinstein has stated. Weinstein says the state is on clear legal grounds to persecute such actions. While the PLO flag could fly, action should be taken as quickly as possible against the flags of other terror groups.

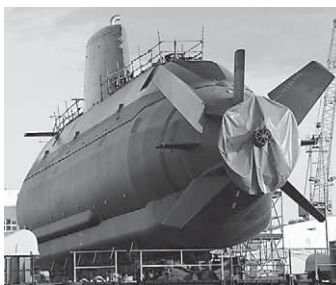
Fourth advanced submarine en route to Israel

Israel will add a fourth advanced Dolphin-Class submarine to its naval fleet, the commander of the Israel Navy said at a ceremony for graduates of a naval course. “The INS Tanin can dive deeper, go further for a longer time and can operate at a level we have not seen until today.”

The INS Tanin will bolster a submarine fleet that has seen dramatic increases in the number and duration of its operational at-sea deployments over the past several years. Israel is also scheduled to receive a fifth Dolphin-Class submarine from Germany, the INS Rahav, later in 2014.

The new submarines have engines that don’t require surfacing to acquire new air supplies, effectively expanding Israel’s naval reach and allowing for more distant and long-lasting operations.

Israel indicts Hamas mastermind behind kidnapping and murder of three teens

An IDF military court has indicted Hussam Hassam Qawasme for his involvement in the kidnapping and murder of three Israeli teens in June, an atrocity that eventually set off the recent Gaza war.

Qawasme is a command-level Hamas operative, who obtained funding for the kidnapping from his brother, a Hamas member expelled by Israel to the Gaza Strip as part of the Gilad Shalit deal. The funding likely came from Hamas in Gaza.

The atrocity itself was subcontracted to two lower-level Hamas terrorists, one of them a relative of Qawasme. Their whereabouts are currently unknown.

Israel preparing for war against Hezbollah?

Not long after a ceasefire ended a 50-day Israel-Hamas conflict, the Israeli army is “making plans and training” for “a very violent war” against Hezbollah in south Lebanon, an Israeli TV report claimed, without specifying when this war might break out.

The report, for which the army gave Israel’s Channel 2 access to several of its positions along the border with Lebanon, featured an IDF brigade commander warning that such a conflict “will be a whole different story” from the Israel-Hamas conflict. “We will have to use considerable force” to quickly prevail over the Iranian-backed Hezbollah, “to act more decisively, more drastically,” said Colonel Dan Goldfus, commander of the 769th Hiram Infantry Brigade.

The report said Hezbollah has an estimated 100,000 rockets – 10 times as many as were in the Hamas arsenal – and that its 5,000 long-range missiles, located in Beirut and other areas deep inside Lebanon, are capable of carrying large warheads with precision guidance systems, covering all of Israel.

From the parents of Daniel Tregerman to UN Secretary General



Dear Sir,

My name is Gila, I am an Israeli citizen, and I am a resident of Kibbutz Nahal Oz, near the border with Gaza.

A week ago, we lost our elder son, Daniel 4½-years-old, when he was killed by a mortar shell fired from Gaza into Israel.

I address you after your announcement to Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, to establish an international investigation committee to investigate "Israel's crime" in the recent fighting in Gaza.

About us: Doron and I were married five years ago and we have three amazing kids: Daniel, Yoav 3½-years and Uri 4 months old. We were a happy family. We lived in Kibbutz Nahal Oz near Gaza, and found ourselves constantly debating whether not to abandon Nahal Oz and move to another location, quieter, safer, far from rocket fire from Gaza, and far away from the alarms.

Then came the threat of terrorist tunnels, which Hamas members dug from Gaza to Israel under our home to hurt us. At night we heard noises and voices digging beneath us. Thus, in the last six months our children slept with the window closed and locked. We were afraid that they will be kidnapped from us.

Can you imagine our life, Mr Secretary-General? How do you live in constant fear of mortar shell and terrorists emerging from tunnels?

Then, last Friday [22 August], Daniel was killed. All the precautions we had taken failed. Daniel was killed in our House, while playing with Yoav in a tent built indoors and not outside, because it's dangerous. He was killed by a mortar shell, fired by terrorists from Gaza. He died in our hands, in front of his little sister and his best friend. He died in front of Uri and right before our eyes.

We failed. We couldn't protect our beautiful and talented baby. The mortar shell that was fired by Hamas members from an elementary school for boys in Gaza City. It wasn't a stray shell. It wasn't accidental death. From that school terrorists fired deliberately at the kibbutz to murder civilians – children, women, old people. Daniel was killed almost immediately. Daniel's father, Doron, covered him with a blanket while crying bitterly and we escaped from home with two small children, leaving our precious son behind, in order to protect them from bombings that continued to explode around the house. Yoav understood that something terrible happened. It is unbearable to watch that little child staring at the wall, in silence with teardrops from her eyes.

During the *shiv'ah* (Jewish ritual of mourning) at Doron's parents home, we heard of your decision to appoint an international investigation committee to investigate "Israel's crime" during the recent fighting in Gaza. You informed Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu half an hour after our Daniel was killed.

The investigation committee will examine the "crimes of Israel" during the fighting.

The investigation committee is not asked to investigate how terrorists shoot out of UN buildings and schools.

The committee is not asked to investigate how inside buildings of the United Nations and in hospitals in Gaza terrorist infrastructure flourishes and is maintained over time, or how from these places terrorists depart for activity aimed against innocent people.

It won't investigate how Hamas abuses the Palestinian people, and how its members force residents of Gaza, even children, to dig tunnels aimed only for terrorism against Israel.

It won't investigate how after these excavations, carried out under duress and in slave-like conditions, the Hamas murdered the diggers, even the children, just to be sure they don't pass information to Israel.

Why are you silent? Does your silence indicate consent with the abuse of the Palestinian people and the Israeli people?

Do you and the UN not see the links that make up the global terrorism picture?

The terrorist units that attacked us in our homes are the same units that kidnapped 43 UN observers in Syria; that decapitated innocent people in Syria and Iraq; crashed aircrafts into crowded buildings in 2001 in New York. These units threaten the essence of democratic life, and life itself, everywhere.

My husband's parents also live near the border fence and three and a half years ago a Qassam rocket exploded and destroyed their home.

They used to have good relations with the residents of Gaza. They hired workers from Gaza to work in their fields and Paulina, Daniel's grandmother, drove them home – to Rafah, every evening after work. They invited each other for weddings and other celebrations and often travelled to Rafah or Gaza to enjoy life at cafes there.

All that ended when Hamas rose to power and ordered the civilians who worked in Israel to kill their Israeli employers; otherwise, Hamas would hurt their families. Daniel's grandparents hoped that the good proximity would resume. They found ways to maintain contact with their friends from Gaza during the mortar shelling. Like Doron's parents and their Gazan friends, we also want to live in good proximity, in peace and security. It is our hope that our neighbours, the people of Gaza, will be able to live peacefully in their homes and build and develop their beautiful country. We believe that the majority of the people on this planet do not want to see the sights of blood, tears and fire of the radical Islam movement, but to live peacefully, enjoy kid's laughter, wait for a better tomorrow.

We do not seek the people responsible for our Daniel's death.

We only wish your response and your voice against this crime and the crime Hamas has committed against their own people.

The Israeli "land grab" that wasn't

A settlement paradox – After a six-month silent freeze on new settlement permissions, the Israeli government took an administrative action that does not enable a single Israeli to move across the Green Line, and yet was met with unusual outrage and condemnation from John Kerry, Europe and the UN. Then it launched a building project that would let over 2000 families move across the Green Line in Jerusalem, and not a word of criticism has been heard.

Lets start with the so-called "land expropriation" for settlements, as it has widely been described in the press. That characterisation is entirely wrong, and appears to uncritically recycle unsupported allegations in a *Peace Now* press release. The declaration is neither an expropriation, nor for settlements.

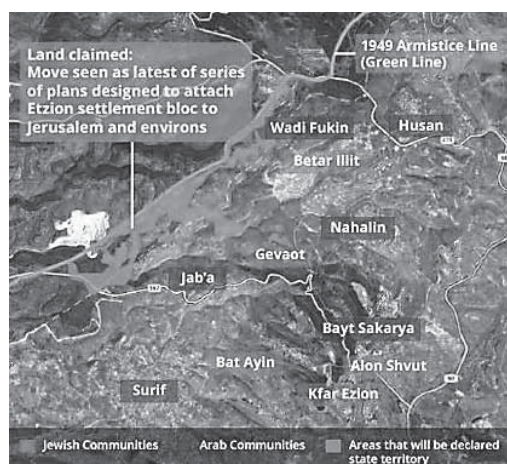
Indeed, Israel's action is not a seizure, a taking, expropriation, or confiscation. Nor does it establish a new settlement, expand settlements, or in any way change the demographics of the territory.

A determination that land is "state land" is a factual, administrative finding that does not change the ownership of land. In the West Bank massive amounts of land have no private owners. There is nothing unusual about this; indeed, it is even truer inside the Green Line. Moreover, if Israel is indeed an occupying power, it has a duty to administer and maintain the rule of law, and oversee public resources, both of which require the authorities to know what land has private owners and what does not.

An "appropriation" involves taking something that is someone's. A designation of land as "state land" requires a determination, based on extensive investigation, that it does not have a private owner. The determination can be challenged administratively and judicially, as Palestinian claimants often do, and sometimes prevail.

In other words, nothing has been taken from anyone, or given to anyone. Thus a "state land" determination does not create any new facts or change ownership.

Moreover, designating an area state land does not mean that a Jewish community can be built on it.



Both illegal Jewish and Arab building on state land is often demolished. Authorising a new residential community would require a vast number of additional administrative and political permissions, none of which appear to be remotely forthcoming. Indeed, those who object to Israel's recent action also object Jews living or even studying on undisputedly private Jewish-owned land in the West Bank.

The hysteria over this announcement illustrates several points. First, it reflects how detached discussions of "illegal settlements" are from international law. The entire legal argument against settlements rests on one sentence of the Fourth Geneva Convention, which prohibits an "occupying power" to "deport or transfer parts of its own civilian population" into the territory it occupies.

None of that has anything to do with the occupying power determining the ownership status

of the land, an action that does not transfer or help transfer, and indeed, has nothing to do with the movement of people.

On the other hand, Israel also announced the construction of thousands of housing units in eastern Jerusalem for Arab Israelis. If the Geneva Convention indeed forbids building apartments in occupied territory for one's nationals, it does so without any ethnic discrimination. The question would not be whether the "settlers" are Jews or Arabs, but whether they are part of Israel's "civilian population." Yet on this action, the international community was entirely silent.

The outrage over Israel's "settlement" actions has no basis in law. Moving people is settlement activity, but only when done by Jews. Not moving people is also settlement activity. "Settlement activity" has just become a term of opprobrium with legal pretensions...

Bibi has quietly done exactly what all his critics in the peace camp have long demanded [by not announcing new settlement construction]. But instead of bringing Abbas to the table, it has sent him on unilateral attacks at the UN and ICC. So instead of giving Netanyahu credit for his silent freeze – credit that would raise serious questions about Abbas's sincerity – *Peace Now* and the international community simply define settlements down.

When I heard the news that American journalist Steven Sotloff had been beheaded by the radical jihadist group ISIS, I immediately began checking the Internet to find out more about his Jewish connections.

Two weeks earlier, after he appeared in the James Foley beheading video, *JTA* confirmed that he was Jewish, but decided not to report on his faith because of the danger it posed to him in the hands of his captors.

What I did not know then was that Sotloff's online presence had been thoroughly purged of any mention of his connections to Judaism and Israel.

After Sotloff's abduction in Syria in August 2013, over 150 of his friends scoured the Internet, including Facebook and Twitter, to remove every mention of his Jewishness and connections to Israel.

In addition, any articles he wrote for Israel-connected publications, including the *Jerusalem Report*, also were deleted from the Web.

Even his Facebook account was deleted. A friend said, “We had two missions: To locate all of his friends worldwide – and he had many – and make sure they don’t talk to journalists. In addition, we had to convince journalists who were writing about him to cooperate with us and remove

any connection between him and Israel or Judaism, so his ISIS kidnappers don't find out his background."

"Journalists helped us protect Steven. The entire world was a part of our bond of silence," he said.

Israel's Foreign Ministry did not release the news that Sotloff held dual US-Israeli citizenship until after the video of his beheading had been authenticated.

In the US, a group of Jewish officials and PR professionals, who worked

alongside Sotloff's friends, laboured behind the scenes to make sure that no publications revealed anything about Sotloff's Jewish or Israeli identity after ISIS revealed that it was holding him captive. Although there had been early slips by the *New York Times* and *Orlando Sentinel*, once the effort ramped up, Sotloff's secret stayed safe.

"Everyone rallied behind the notion that revealing this information, though it's an incredibly important part of the story, could jeopardise a life," said one person involved in that effort.

Sotloff, a grandson of Holocaust survivors who grew up in Miami, made aliyah in 2005 and studied foreign relations at the Interdisciplinary Centre in Herzliya. He then began reporting from countries throughout the Middle East, returning to Israel for the 2013 Maccabiah Games.

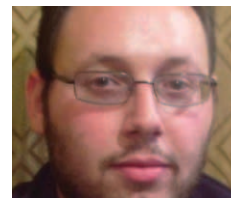
Other journalists who had been held with Sotloff and then released confirmed that the ISIS captors were not aware of his connections to Judaism and Israel.

One former captive said that Sotloff was able to fast last year on Yom Kippur without his captors knowing.

"He told them he was sick and did not want to eat, even though that day we were served eggs," the fellow captive said. He added that Sotloff also was able to pray in a hidden manner and in the proscribed way facing Jerusalem by looking which way the Muslims prayed in order to determine the proper direction.

The decision to delete Sotloff's online presence was one of the lessons learned from the kidnapping of Jewish-American reporter Daniel Pearl, who was killed by a member of Al-Qaeda in Pakistan in 2002.

But now that Sotloff's life is tragically over, his secret has been told, and his friends the world over can openly mourn the man – the Israeli, the Jew – that they knew, loved and tried so hard to protect. *Telegraph*



Stars, loved ones, farewell Joan Rivers

Howard Stern delivered the eulogy, Broadway singer-actress Audra McDonald sang *Smile* and bagpipers played *New York, New York* at Joan Rivers' funeral, a star-studded send-off that – like the late comedian herself – brought together the worlds of Hollywood, theatre, fashion and media.

At a funeral befitting a superstar, the New York City Gay Men's Chorus sang Broadway hits before six-time Tony Award-winner McDonald sang her tribute to Rivers, a champion of theatre for decades. Tributes and reminiscences were delivered by TV anchor Deborah Norville, close friend Margie Stern, columnist Cindy Adams and Rivers' daughter, Melissa.

"So sad to say goodbye to one of our friends, but it was so joyful," Norville said. "Hugh Jackman had us on our feet clapping for Joan." Hugh Jackman sang at the end, and bagpipers from the NYPD played on the streets as mourners filed out of Temple Emanu-El, many dabbing their eyes.

The funeral program included a page with three classic Rivers' lines printed out: "Can we talk?" "Who are you wearing?" and "Because I'm a funny person."

Howard Stern's eulogy, however, seemed to be the most memorable moment. Those in attendance described it as raucous and uncensored.

"Just the way she would've wanted it," her former security guard Louie said. "Very, very glitzy. True to Joan Rivers' standards."

"I don't think Temple Emanu-El has ever heard anything like it," said former New York politician Andrew Stein. "Howard Stern was very naughty, but very funny. I can't repeat what he said."

Mourners lined up outside the Fifth Avenue synagogue and waited for their names to be checked against a list before entering. A large contingent of fans nearly filled up an entire city block.

The comedian detailed in her 2012 book *I Hate Everyone – Starting With Me* that she hoped for "a huge showbiz affair with lights, cameras, action" and "Hollywood all the way." Instead of a rabbi talking, Rivers asked for "Meryl Streep crying, in five different accents" and "a wind machine so that even in the casket my hair is blowing just like Beyoncé's." Indeed, her wishes were so important they were printed in the funeral program.

Rivers was a trailblazer for all comics, but especially for women. The raspy-voiced blonde with the brash New York accent was a TV talk show host, stage, film and TV actress, fashion critic, and she sold a line of jewellery.

The cause of death is being investigated. Rivers was hospitalised on 28 August after she went into cardiac arrest during a routine throat procedure at a doctor's office.

Peter Bart, Executive Vice president and Editorial Director of *Variety Magazine*, said, "As with many other famed performers, Joan Rivers was the opposite of the public person she raucously portrayed. Crass on stage, she was elegant in private with a kindly, understated presence. She was well read and thoughtful in real life." CBS

What The Kindergarten Teacher might teach us

Aptly described as "strange and provocative" (MUBI.com) *Ha-Ganenet*, a second film by Israeli writer Director Nadav Lapid, challenges its audience. The film portrays Israeli society – and perhaps the world at large – as painfully crass and morally adrift. We meet the movie's namesake, Nira (Sarit Larry), as a vaguely dissatisfied wife, mother and kindergarten teacher aching to find, express, and protect poetry in her world. Her discovery of a poetic 5-year-old prodigy among her students changes her life.

Young Yoav (Avi Schnaidman) composes profound and extraordinary verse, perhaps emerging out of the pain of his parents' divorce,

his mother's absence, his father's materialism and apparent indifference.

Nira's passion for the poetic and the young poet has disastrous consequences for the teacher, her husband and the sad, small wordsmith with whom she becomes obsessed.

While the camera's views intrigue the audience, the boy's views ultimately are not revealed. We leave the film with a sense of being unanchored in a profane world without poetry and without sense.

Ha-Ganenet offers audiences no admirable or likable adult characters. The small boy, thrown about in the ugly life storms of the thoughtless



adults who surround him, emerges as the single innocent and likable character of the film.

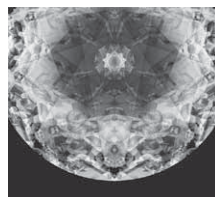
Ultimately, he may be the teacher – reminding us of a timely message as Rosh Hashanah nears – that in spite of the world's foulness, poetry and hope cannot be kidnapped.

Rosh Hashanah



Sweet Potato Tzimmes

SERVES 8

An Eastern European standard, tzimmes is a roasted vegetable dish. For Rosh Hashanah, the ingredients include carrots and sweet potatoes, with the added sweetness of fresh and dried fruits. Recipe adapted from *Vegan Holiday Kitchen* by Nava Atlas.

Ingredients

2 tablespoons olive oil
1 cup chopped onions
3 large carrots, sliced
3 large sweet potatoes, cooked, baked, or microwaved in their skins, then peeled and sliced
1 large apple or pear, cored and sliced
½ cup chopped prunes
¼ cup chopped dried apricots
½ cup orange juice
1½ teaspoons cinnamon
½ teaspoon each: ground ginger and salt
⅓ to ½ cup chopped walnuts, optional

Method

Preheat the oven to 180°C.
Heat the oil in a large skillet. Sauté the onions over medium heat until they are translucent. Add the carrots and continue to sauté until onions and carrots are golden.
In a mixing bowl, combine the onion-carrot mixture with all the remaining ingredients except walnuts. Mix thoroughly; don't worry if the potato slices break apart.
Transfer the mixture to a large, oiled, shallow baking dish. Sprinkle the optional walnuts over the top. Bake for 45 to 50 minutes, or until the top begins to turn slightly crusty.
